

Rheingau

The growing region:

The Rheingau is unique among Germany's 13 wine-growing regions. Its many premium locations, unusual climate conditions and long history give it an undisputed special status. On its 1300 kilometre journey from Switzerland to the North Sea the Rhine leaves its northwesterly course only once, at Mainz, turning to the southwest for 35 kilometres. That gives the Rheingau hills on the right bank from Wicker to Lorchhausen a sunny south-southwest facing, for ideal wine-growing conditions.

JOERN Winery

Oenologist Jörn Goziewski took the leap to self-employment in 2014, fulfilling his long-held dream of an own winery. Even as a child, Jörn knew he wanted to be a vintner. This self-proclaimed Man With The Good Nose was always fascinated by the natural smells and flavours of his home region. At his winery in the Rheingau, he uses his experience as a sommelier and dedicates himself with heart, soul and passion to the traditional local wines and unique vintages. He concentrates on Pinot Noir, and especially Riesling wines. His philosophy is marked by the courage to innovate, as are the splendid wines from Jörn Goziewski's winery.
